Dear Parent/Carers,

Welcome back to our new academic year and welcome to our new EYFS pupils and families who start their first part time day of school next Monday. I hope you had a wonderful summer and enjoyed the plentiful sunshine. The staff are all ready for the new term and we spent 2 exciting days training in preparation for the new year.

New values

After extensive work with our school council, parent council and staff we have changed the existing 11 values to 5 to ensure these are more manageable and consistent.

Our new values moving forward are:

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The children will be introduced to the new values on their return to school assembly. The school council have chosen the explanations for each value and these will be introduced to the pupils and added to our school website. Rewards for demonstrating the values will remain the same in the form of a pebble, collected towards a whole school values event that will be chosen by our school council. Children can still be nominated for a values certificate and badge to collect our 9 values characters.

New school times

The school day will now start at 8.45am and end at 3.15pm. Any children who arrive at school after 8.55am will be marked as late. Phonics and reading activities start at 9am and it is vital your child is in school for these times.

New EYFS parents Tea and Chat event – Monday 18th September 9-10am

Once you have dropped your child off to their new teacher, please come and join us for refreshments to meet the SLT and pastoral staff and other parents. This event will be held in the KS1 hall and signposts will direct you from the reception classrooms.

Enrichment Clubs

Over the school year, each teacher will be running a 6 week club to enrich our curriculum offer. These clubs will be on a first come, first served basis and will be booked via our Arbor system. Over the next few weeks Mrs Thompson will be adding the club offers to the Arbor app and send a supporting message. The pupils will also be notified of the clubs on offer. These clubs are in addition to the existing clubs currently on offer.

Book time

Book time will recommence on Thursday 14th September for Years R-2. All parents or relatives are invited to come in and hear their child read from 8.45am to 9am. Please enter via your child's classroom door if you wish to attend.

Flashback Friday for Years 2-6

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Flashback Fridays are designed to support the child recap prior learning and to discover what learning will occur the following week. A weekly PowerPoint will continue to be shared with you so you are aware of the learning that has and will take place.

We do ask that when parents attend the Flashback Friday event that you help us by being respectful and listening to the class teacher as this session is a teaching activity. If a younger sibling is disruptive, we ask politely for you to remove the child to the corridor. All pushchairs are to remain outside to not block fire exits. Thank you for your support with this matter.

Communication procedures

In the case of a child's absence, parents/carers are expected to notify the school by 9am or a text prompt will be sent.

Behaviour routines

Over the last few years we have noticed that we have had a slight decline in low level behaviour and have taken the steps to reevaluate our behaviour policy and turn this into a relationship policy. Staff have had training in our new behaviour procedures and these will be published onto our school website during the next few weeks.
